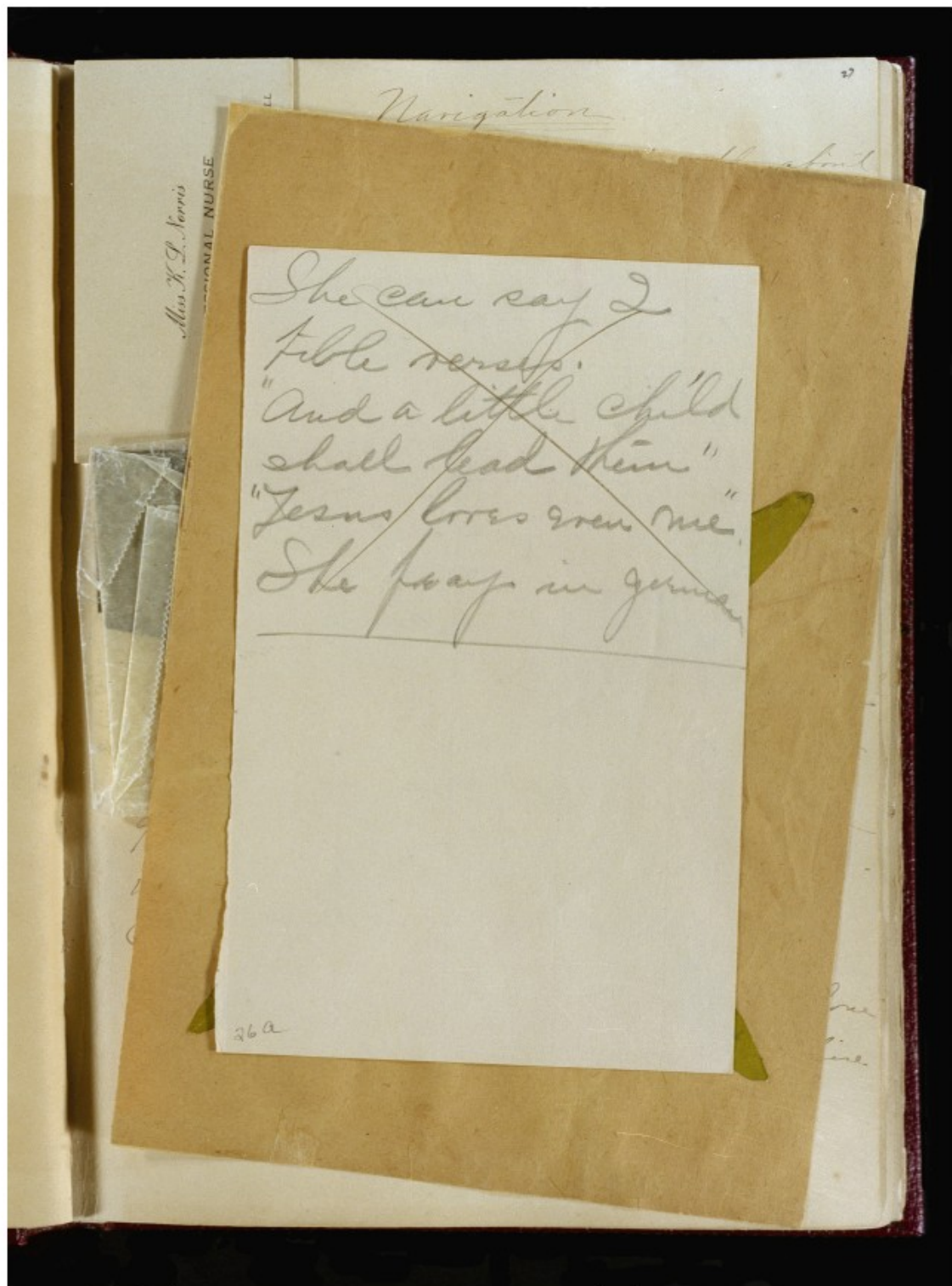

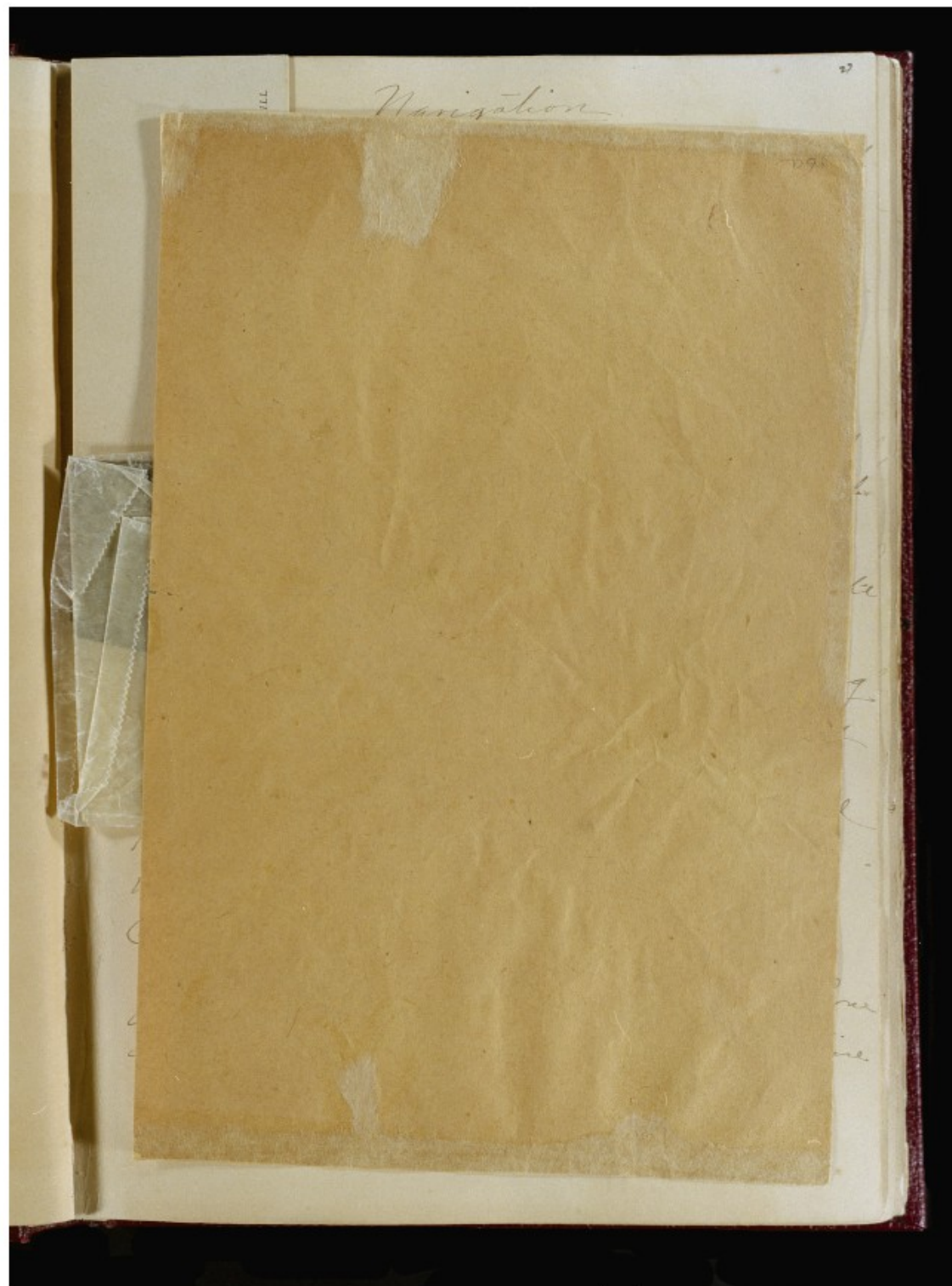

He knows when Mamma begins to make the "tobbe mimmy" on the fan. He recognizes Daddy out of the window.

When Grandpa came home from California, Ernest Miller was very much afraid of him, and screamed lustily.

He eats crackers, potato and gravy, cereals, etc. He loves to stum on the piano & sing. Loves to hear Daddy play the ramish horn and cornet, will stop and smile in the middle of a howl, for a blow on the cornet. Plays "Puck-a-tus" all himself with the sheet.

At $7\frac{3}{4}$ months he began to "da-da-da" and talk incessantly, also to roll over and creep backwards, and stand, holding on to chairs or our knees.

At 9 1/2 months he raises himself

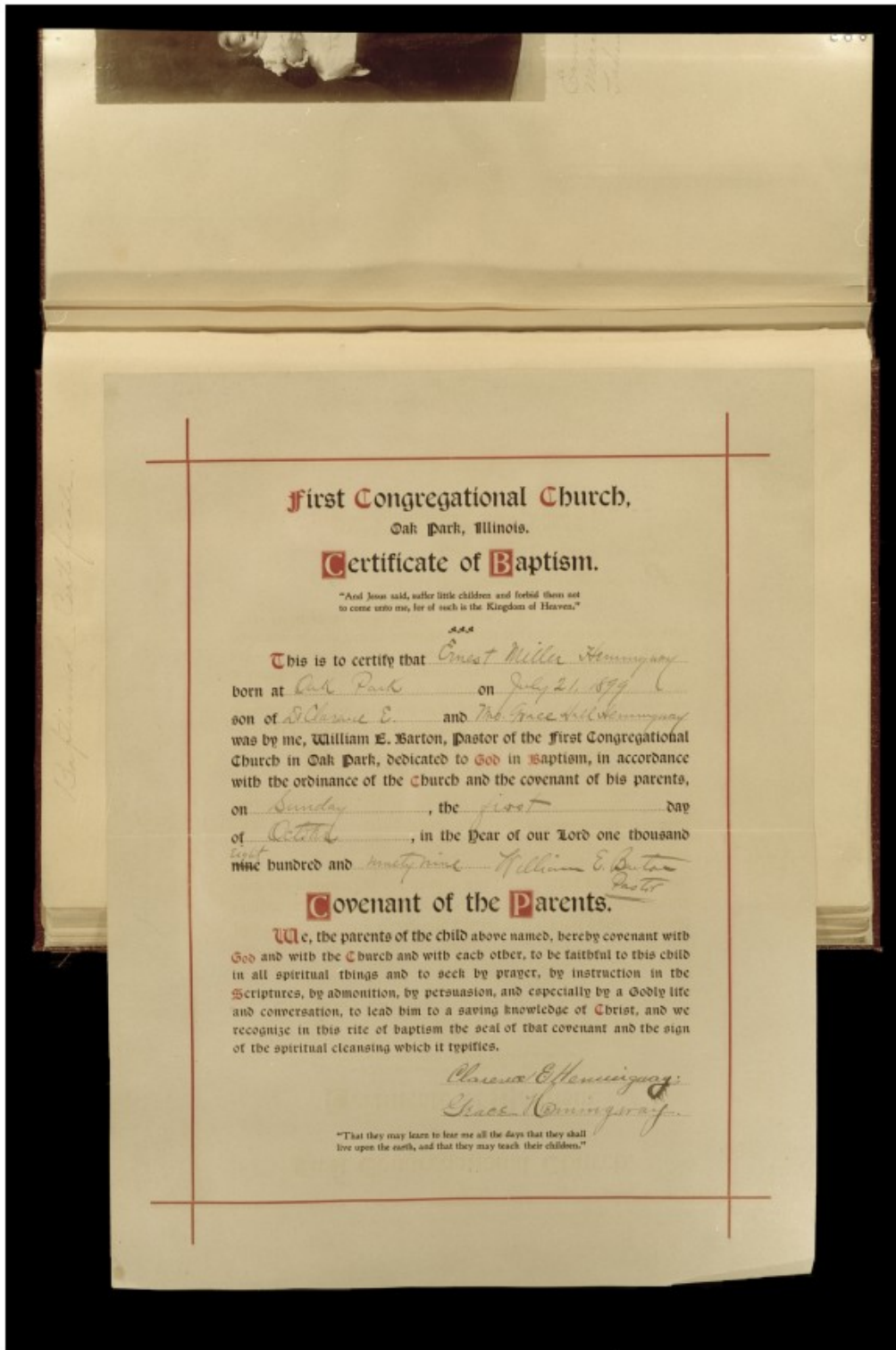

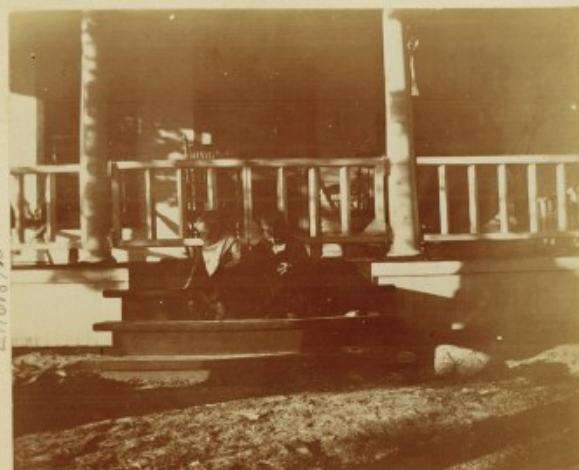

story. Among the first stories
that he took great delight in, at
the age of 15 months, was, when
Papa would tell him how when
Prince was a little baby having
he had such long legs and such
a short neck, that he had to get

Owl stories are his greatest
delight at 16 and 17 months, as

prayed a few words, he jumps up and says "Amen".

He stomps and kicks and bawls with rage, when thwarted, and will stand any amount of rough usage when playing. Has good grit. He comes and claps you when you don't cut him, and kisses you when he is sorry.

Ernest learned to kiss at about 14 months old with a genuine smack.

On Christmas day Ernest Miller was so happy with all the inexhaustible supply of things, and the turkey bones, and Christmas tree. He and Marcellus had soon got their little mouths well "ah-dee" (apple) and piece of popcorn within reach. All the Hines and Hemingway family, Mrs. Mary Williams, Katherine Coffer and Irish Katie were present with us at our Christmas tree.

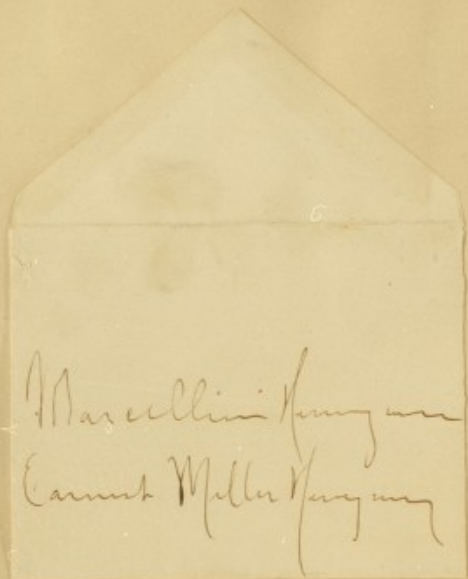

Ernest Miller at 22 months old says every thing in his own derjonted fashion. "Nies-told drink-wätter Emmy wäit" is what he shouts out, from his bed, on a hot night.

He has called his mother *Trotte* (*Sorotie*) ever since he was 14 or 15 months old, sometimes saying it by *Trotte Bear*. We are all members of the Bear family and have been for 5 or 6 months. There is *Atta Bear*, *Da-Bear* or (*Daddy Bear*), *Trotte Bear*, *Nannie Bear* (*Katherine*), *Fanning Nanna Bear* (*Margaret Harold*), *Mochee Bear* or

Siggie Bear, or *Ernie Bear*, more commonly known as *Puny*.

Ernest Miller went to Ringling Bros Circus at about 21 months old, and enjoyed it hugely. He saw performing elephants, and is never tired of hearing you tell him about them.

Early on so early, in the morning you hear, "Tell Ernie bout dat big elephant, Da-Bear."

In telling us about it, E. M. said "Ernie sing bear-bear song unner dat circus". He really did, when he got too excited to hold in any longer.

"Siffa Satta" is Simple Simon Ernest says.

"Siffa Satta met a pie-man
Going to dat Jay-ah."

This morning he tried to play clown and turn summer saitts. He imitates the family with a perfectly serious face. He loves to walk like an elephant and imitate all sorts of animals. He made a joke at 22 months of

age. (rog) called (laudehim) "dannel lions" - dannel horses" and would chuckle with laughter over the fun of it.

He appreciates a joke wonderfully. I told him, on one of our drives that a certain little dog kennel was the home of Mr. Billy Goat, Mrs. Nanny Goat, and all the little Patti-ties (potticats). He would chuckle with glee at this.

He went to Paunce Bill's wild west show, and was much taken with his "Indians" and cowboys. He loves to play that he is Paunce Bill and shoots Mocking, for an Indian. Then she must fall down dead. June 1st, I was looking at his teeth and discovered that he had cut 3 of his last 4 double teeth. We never knew he was doing it. The last or 20th tooth is now swollen in the gum. He shoots with a bow

and arrow and dances like a young Bear Cub. Dances "a take walk." He knows most of the colors, "red," "too," "fack," "deer."

Oct 31 months he can say quite plainly Margarete, Marcelline, and Katherine. He sings songs and plays at the piano. There are some little songs with marginal illustration, for instance a donkey. This he calls the "He-haw song" and is very He-haw, He-haw, He-haw on any note with dashing accompaniment, like the Bear-Bear Song, Balloon Song, and Chinese Bear Song.
